The UNFPA has received funding from the United Nations Trust Fund to Eliminate Violence against Women to improve multi-sectoral response to gender based violence at the district level in Nepal. The project will be jointly implemented by UNFPA, UNICEF and UNIFEM in close collaboration with MWCSW.

Eligibility: The applicant should have advanced degree in women's studies, social work, international relations, social sciences or other relevant field; five years of progressively responsible professional working experience in programme planning, management, monitoring and evaluation, coordination, learning and knowledge share especially in the area of GBV with international organizations preferably within the UN system; knowledge of population and development, reproductive health and gender; demonstrated leadership, facilitation, and team working skills and ability to establish harmonious working relations in an international and multi-cultural environment; and demonstrated capability of good understanding of GBV issues as well as the work of the Government in gender at both central and district levels.
