4 rounds of assessments of public health facilities were conducted to inform government and other partners about planning sexual and reproductive health response.



Supported in developing the Interim Guidelines for Reproductive, Maternal, New Born, Child and Adolescent Health and oriented 3,454 health programme managers and service providers on it.



Procured **7,248** PPE sets and **275** Inter Agency Reproductive Health Kits, 3,600 units of hand sanitizer, 500,000 pairs of examination gloves and 50,000 masks.



33,303
pregnant women
were helped, with
essential and timely
emergency obstetric and
neonatal care through
teleconsultations
through 520 health
facilities.



102 pregnant women provided with free ambulance services in 16 districts.



670 women in remote areas given family planning counseling and services through visiting service providers.



8.8 million people, including pregnant and new mothers, reached through sexual and reproductive health messaging.



6,506 callers reached with sexual and reproductive health information and counseling services through toll-free helplines.
