Title:	National Communications Consultant – Development of IEC Materials for GBV and SRH in Emergencies			
Background	Nepal is highly vulnerable to natural disasters and humanitarian crises, includicanthquakes, floods, landslides, and other emergencies, which often disproportionate affect women and girls. These crises exacerbate pre-existing vulnerabilities, disrupticances to critical services and leaving communities unprepared to address the heighten risks of gender-based violence (GBV) and the unmet needs for sexual and reproduction health (SRH) services. In emergencies, access to life-saving SRH care and robin mechanisms to prevent and respond to GBV are essential to safeguarding the heal safety, and dignity of affected populations. Recognizing these challenges, the development of culturally appropriate and actional information, education, and communication (IEC) materials has been prioritized strengthen awareness and response mechanisms for GBV and SRH in emergencies. The materials will serve as critical tools to guide communities, service providers, a stakeholders in effectively addressing GBV and SRH needs during humanitarian crises. The initiative will be implemented in collaboration with the Ministry of Women Children, and Senior Citizens under the leadership of the GBV Sub-Cluster. Provincial level consultations, community feedback, and stakeholder validation processes with ensure that the IEC materials are contextually relevant, practical, and aligned with the needs of diverse communities in high-risk areas. Through this effort, UNFPA aims the enhance preparedness, build capacity, and empower individuals and communities trespond to GBV and SRH challenges effectively during emergencies.			
Scope of work: (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	The Communications Consultant will develop culturally sensitive and actionable IEC (Information, Education, and Communication) materials focused on addressing GBV and SRH needs in emergency contexts. The consultant will work closely with the Ministry of Women, Children, and Senior Citizens under the guidance of the GBV Sub-Cluster and in collaboration with UNFPA. This role involves stakeholder consultations, material development, validation processes, and finalization of IEC tools to ensure their relevance and effectiveness in high-risk and diverse community settings. Key Responsibilities: 1. Conduct consultations and stakeholder meetings at federal and provincial levels, including the Ministry of Women, Children, and Senior Citizens, GBV Sub-Cluster members, and implementing partners, to gather inputs and define priorities for IEC materials. 2. Design and develop IEC materials for GBV and SRH in emergencies, ensuring content is culturally appropriate, actionable, and aligns with national policies and guidelines. 3. Organize and facilitate focus group discussions with women and girls in high-risk provinces (both hill and Terai areas) to collect feedback and ensure materials are contextually relevant.			

- 4. Lead provincial-level validation workshops to finalize the IEC materials engaging UNFPA provincial focal point, and gather inputs from stakeholders, including local authorities and community representatives.
- 5. Revise and finalize the IEC materials based on feedback from the focus group discussions and validation workshops.
- 6. Ensure the IEC materials incorporate elements of risk communication and are accessible, inclusive, and practical for use by diverse stakeholders, including communities and service providers.

Expected outputs/deliverables of the consultancy are:

The Consultant shall ensure:

- The development of draft IEC materials addressing GBV and SRH in emergencies, ensuring content is culturally sensitive, actionable, and aligned with national policies and guidelines.
- Organization and facilitation of validation workshops at the provincial and federal levels, including detailed reports documenting stakeholder feedback and recommendations.
- A comprehensive consultation report summarizing key insights, recommendations, and priorities gathered from stakeholder meetings and focus group discussions with women and girls in high-risk provinces (hill and Terai areas).
- Finalized IEC materials incorporating inputs from focus group discussions (consultant to make FDG Guide) and validation workshops, designed and prepared for dissemination.
- Submission of an end-of-consultancy report summarizing achievements, lessons learned, and recommendations for future use and scale-up of IEC materials in emergency preparedness and response.

The Consultant will report to the Humanitarian Specialist and through her to the Deputy Representative as well as to the entire Humanitarian Response team assigned by the Resident Representative.

Expected travel:

The Consultant will travel to provinces for the consultation and validation of the IEC materials.

- Master's degree in journalism, mass communication, public health, gender studies, or a related field.
- At least 2-5 years of experience in developing and designing communication materials, including IEC materials, for humanitarian or development contexts.
- Proven ability to create culturally sensitive, high-quality communication materials tailored to diverse audiences.
- Demonstrated understanding of Gender-Based Violence (GBV), Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), and their importance in emergency settings.
- Experience working with diverse teams, including government stakeholders, civil society, and community representatives, particularly in Nepal.
- Strong knowledge of SRHR and GBV issues within the Nepalese context, including familiarity with national policies and frameworks.

Skills and Competencies

- Excellent writing, storytelling, and design skills for producing impactful communication materials.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills to effectively engage with stakeholders and facilitate participatory processes.
- Proven ability to manage multiple tasks, work under pressure, and meet tight deadlines.
- Proficiency in tools for communication material development, including Microsoft Office Suite and design tools like Adobe Creative Suite.

Languages

- Fluency in written and spoken Nepali and English is required.
- Knowledge of additional local languages in high-risk provinces will be an advantage.
