Eligibility: Master's degree in Public Health, Health Management or Social Sciences with at least 2 years' professional experience in planning, programming, implementation, monitoring and evaluation, preferably in the area of, Family Planning, SCM, Youth and Sexual Reproductive health and gender. Purpose of consultancy:	Sexual and reproductive health is recognized as a fundamental human right and access to basic health services is guaranteed by the constitution of Nepal, 2015. In the past two and half decades, Nepal has made notable progress in improving the overall health outcomes of the citizens but a significant equity gap, however, persists. Nepal has one of the highest maternal mortality rates in the Asia Pacific region (239 per 100,000), and also the highest unmet need for FP amongst adolescents (35%). In Sudurpashchim Province, the unmet need for family planning is 21.5% and the family planning demand satisfied by the modern method is 62.4 %. The average CPR of the province is 44.2 %, institutional delivery is 83%, and 60% of adolescent birth rate (NMICS, 2019). Following the establishment of the federal republic in 2015, Nepal's health sector is going through a phase of significant changes due to reforms, which calls for an increased strategic focus on UNFPA's work at the Province and local levels.	
	UNFPA has been providing support to Sudurpashchim province and local government to formulate progressive policies and legislations for SRH/FP, gender equality, harmful practices, adolescent and youth, and population dynamics including capacity building on evidence-based planning, humanitarian preparedness, and response and supply chain management. The UNFPA program in Sudurpashchim province primarily covers five (Achham, Bajura, Bajhang, Baitadi, and Kailali) out of a total of nine districts but as a humanitarian agency UNFPA, extends preparedness and response support throughout the province to ensure SRH rights and service delivery. In the province, UNFPA coordinates and collaborates with the government, UN agencies, I/NGO, civil societies, and other stakeholders. In the current CP cycle, UNFPA has been mobilizing its resources by building partnerships with provincial NGOs and in the year 2022 more than 139 thousand USD is being planned under the province intends to achieve an increased capacity of the government to deliver integrated, quality sexual and reproductive health services that target women and adolescent girls, especially the most vulnerable, including in humanitarian situations. Further, UNFPA has been playing a key role to functionalize the RH sector coordination mechanism and co-lead the RH subcluster after the recent COVID-19 crisis.	
	In this context, the UNFPA field office, Dhangadhi requires a Programme Officer (SRHR and FP-SCM) who will be engaged in advocacy and policy dialogue for concerted actions by the provincial and local counterparts, UN system and other development partners, and civil society organizations and networks on issues related to SRHR/FP/SCM in the health sector. The consultant will provide required technical assistance to implementing partner for quality delivery of the RH/FP/SCM program, strengthen key RH sector SCM interventions at the provincial and local level, ensure synergy and linkages with all other relevant UNFPA project activities, ensure quality and monitor effective program delivery at the province and local level. The consultant will further support to assess of the implication for UNFPA's work in the Sudurpashchim province through substantive analysis and assessment of political, social, and economic trends relevant to reproductive health, family planning, Supply Chain Management, and relevant agendas; contributes to provincial and local policy and program formulation, guides program implementation, and ensures program results through monitoring activities.
