UNFPA advocates for policies on, and investments in, CSE, for both in and out of schools adolescents; strengthening teacher's knowledge and capacities on delivery of quality CSE; and improving young people's access to CSE. The DFAT funded CSE project is being implemented in five districts in coordination with the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) and its respective division/unit through various implementing partners.				
	The DFAT funded CSE project is currently in the 5 th year of implementation; phase I project commenced in March 2016 and ended in April 2018; phase II started in May 2018 and ending in July 2021 and is overlapping with 3 rd phase of the project which started in August 2020. Thus, a mid term assessment (MTA) of the phase I and II project was recently completed that reported on the project's achievements, gaps, challenges and lessons learned to inform the strategic direction of phase III programme to strengthen the CSE program. The recommendations of the MTA also highlights strategic engagement for UNFPA as an immediate action forward as well as long-term objective to achieve a gender transformative approach to CSE interventions.
